Journey Through Scripture

Matthew 6:19-24

1. According to verse nineteen, is it right to continue to accumulate things just for the sake of doing so?
2. Jesus made a very direct claim in verse twenty one. According to Him, can your heart be fully devoted to something you are not giving towards?
3. In verse twenty two, Jesus mentions a part of our body that can get us into a lot of trouble. Why is that? Have you ever made a serious financial mistake because you saw something and had to have it?
4. What are the first two words of verse twenty four? Keep that in mind. Now, who can serve God and money?
5. Who is your master? Looking at your checkbook and credit card statement, where would you say your heart is?
6. Pray, if need be, for God to move your heart.

I Timothy 6:6-10, 17-19

1. According to verse seven, what exactly are we taking with us when we step into eternity?
2. What is the danger we see in verses nine and ten of being obsessed with money?
3. According to verse seventeen, is it wrong to enjoy certain things that the Lord provides?
4. What is the command for those who have money in verse eighteen?
5. In verse nineteen, do we see an indication that our giving goes on ahead of us?

II Corinthians 9:6-15

1. What is the promise we see in verse six?
2. In verse seven we see the kind of giver God loves. Is this a reflection of you?
3. According to verses eight through eleven, can anyone out give God?
4. According to verse eleven, why does God bless us with "more," to hoard or be generous?
5. In verse twelve we see that giving is basically saying what to God?
6. Looking at verses thirteen and fourteen, does our giving impact the lives of people?

7. Would you say, according to verse fifteen, that God knows all about sacrificial giving?
8. Begin to ask God, "What would You have me sacrifice for this campaign?"

Proverbs 3:9-10, Malachi 3:6-12 and Luke 6:38

1. According to Proverbs 3:9, what are we supposed to honor God with?
2. Again in verse nine, does God come first or last?
3. And yet again, should He be honored with "some" or "all" of what we have?
4. What is the promise in verse ten?
5. According to Malachi 3:6-9, what crime does God claim people are committing when they do not give?
6. What promise do we see in Malachi 3:10? Can we out give God?
7. According to Luke 6:38 does God bless us according to our giving?

Exodus 35:4-9, 20-21, 29 and 36:4-7

1. According to Exodus 35:5, even though the offering was being taken for the tabernacle and its furnishings, to WHOM was it actually being given?
2. What must be moved, according to Exodus 35:20-21, for someone to be committed to giving? What "moves your heart" in regards to the vision of NewSpring Church?
3. According to Exodus 35:29, was God's vision for the Israelites and this amazing task optional or was it something He commanded to be done?
4. What was the result of the first capital campaign in Scripture? Take a look at Exodus 36:4-7! Pray that this would happen here.
5. What occupation did all of these people have before coming to this place? According to Exodus chapter one and two they had been slaves and AFTER God had set them free and AFTER God had done a significant work they responded by giving generously. What has God done in your life?

1 Chronicles 29:1-19

1. In Scripture David was known as a “man after God’s own heart.” In verses one through five we see his heart exposed through the way he gave. Focus on the end of verse one. WHO did David say this work was meant to glorify?
2. In verse nine we see the people rejoicing in their leaders because they gave to who? Once again we must understand that when we give, whether tithes or offerings, it is a tangible way of saying to God, “I love you!”
3. According to verse twelve, where did David acknowledge that his money and possessions came from?
4. In verse fourteen David counts it a privilege to give. Why?
5. According to verse sixteen, WHO OWNS IT ALL?
6. Spend some time thanking God for your stuff and acknowledging that HE is the owner and you are the manager, and then ask Him what He wants you to do with His stuff in regards to this campaign.

Deuteronomy 8:10-20

1. Read verses ten and eleven and then stop and ask yourself this question: “How blessed have I been in the financial area of my life?” Maybe some things to ponder are your first home or car OR your starting salary at the very first full time job you landed.
2. What is the warning that God issues in verse fourteen? Why is it so easy to forget where we came from?
3. According to verse eighteen, WHY have you been so financially blessed?
4. What happens to us in life if we forget to put God first? (Hint verses nineteen and twenty!)
5. Spend some time thanking the Lord for how far He has brought you in regards to the area of finances and then ask Him how He wants you to use what He has blessed you with to enlarge His kingdom.
